DIRECTIONS

Parking is available at the Sir Allan MacNab Recreation Centre. We will provide maps and directions to the shipwreck site in Hamilton for Sunday's dives on Friday evening.

From London: Take the 401 East to 403 East. Exit 235 towards Bantford/Hamilton. Exit onto Lincoln M. Alexander Pwy E. Take Golf Links Road/Mohawk Road exit, Turn Left at Mohawk Road. Turn Right at Magnolia Drive.

From Toronto: Take the Queen Elizabeth Way towards Niagara/East Hamilton/Fort Erie. Merge on to the 403 West; Merge on to Lincoln M. Alexander Parkway E. Take Golf Links Road/Mohawk Road exit, Turn Left at Mohawk Road. Turn Right at Magnolia Drive.

From Niagara Falls: Take the Queen Elizabeth Way to Toronto and merge on to the Red Hill PWY South, Continue onto Lincoln M. Alexander Pkwy W. Take Golf Links Road/Mohawk Road exit, Turn Right at Mohawk Road. Turn Right at Magnolia Drive.

ACCOMMODATIONS

There are several options convenient to the course facilities. These can be found on the internet using Mapquest.

EQUIPMENT

All participants must bring their own dive gear (including tanks and weights). You should also bring:

- One tank for Saturday's pool session and two tanks Sunday's survey dives. Students are responsible for getting their own air fill.
- Your scuba certification card.
- A notebook. This is for taking notes to take home at the end of the course. We will provide booklets for the field notes and sketches that are required for your NAS certification and that must be submitted before you leave on Sunday. These booklets will need to be submitted to receive your certification.
- Other: drinking water, towel, lawn chair, sunglasses, sunblock, hat, cash for meals, snacks.

We will provide the specialized equipment you need for the course, such as tape measures, dive slates, drafting sets, and waterproof paper.

DIVE SITE

The site we will be surveying on Sunday will be determined on Friday night. We will provide maps to the site on Friday night.

FOOD

All meals are your responsibility.

SAFETY

A certified dive master and a safety diver will be at the site during Sunday's open water dives. We will also have oxygen and a first aid kit on site.
