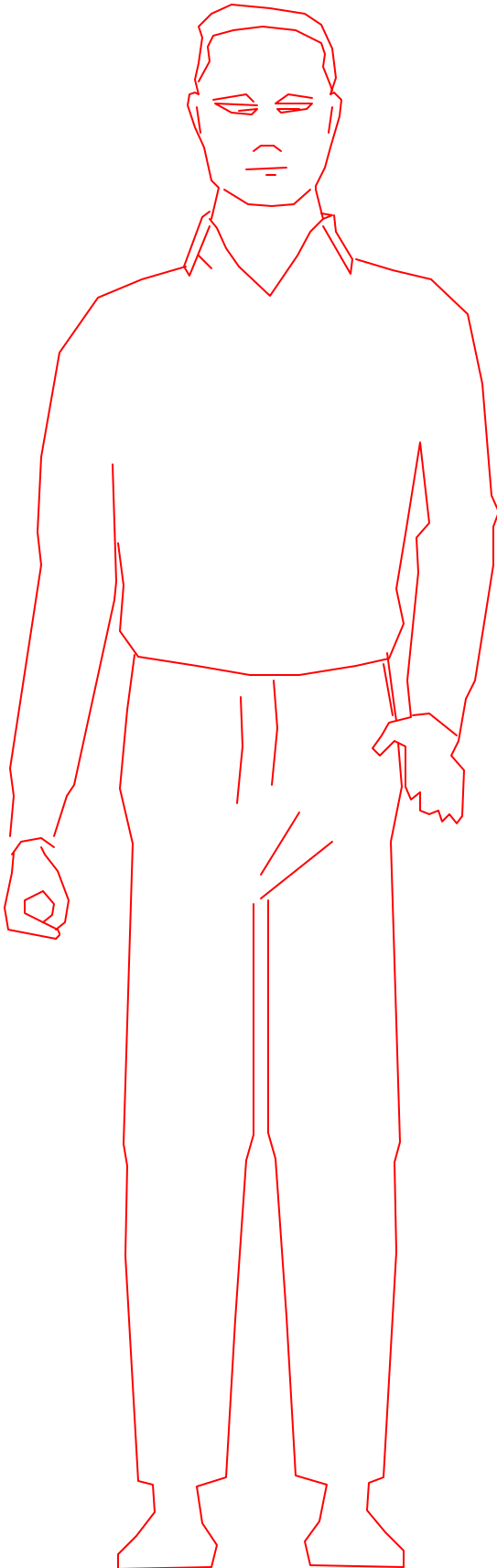


SCENE SURVEY

INTRODUCTION: I am approaching the patient face to face;
"Hi. My name is _____, I am with the Canadian Ski Patrol. May I help you?" "Please do not move until I have checked you for injuries." "I am now going to hold your head."

APPLY MANUAL C-SPINE CONTROL.

Ask questions of the victim to determine condition of victim.

"What is your name?"

"Tell me what happened."

"Does it hurt when you take a deep breath?"

"Please take a deep breath for me." Observe.

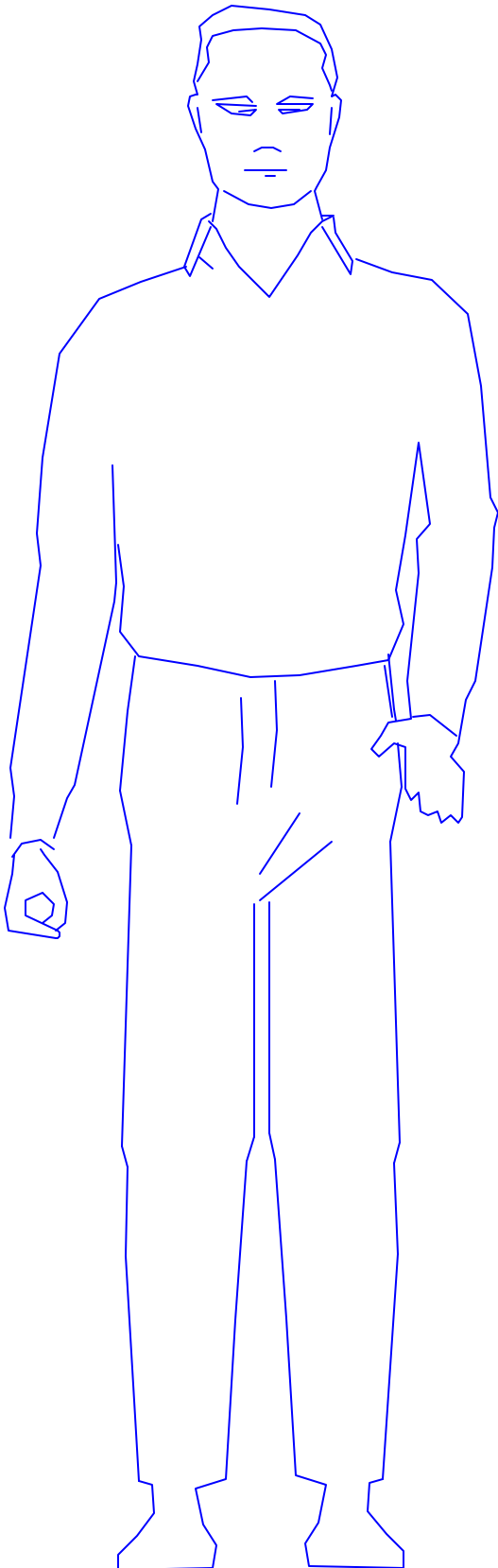
"Do you hurt anywhere?"

"Do you have any pain or tingling in your neck or back?"

"Can you wiggle your toes and fingers?"

If the person answers your questions, you know that the person's airway is not completely obstructed.

I am checking the NECK; looking for DCAP-BLS (Deformities; Contusions; Abrasions; Penetrations; Burns; Lacerations; Swelling); feeling for TIC (Tenderness; Instability; Crepitation); checking my gloves for BLOOD.

I am checking the CHEST; looking for DCAPP-BLS (Paradoxical Movement); feeling for TICS (Subcutaneous Emphysema); checking my gloves for BLOOD.

I am checking the ABDOMEN; look for DCAP-BLS & EVISORATION; feeling for TGRD (Tenderness; Guarding; Rigidity; Distension); checking my gloves for BLOOD.

I am checking the PELVIS; looking for DCAP-BLS & WETNESS; feeling for TIC; checking my gloves for BLOOD.

I am checking both THIGHS; looking for DCAP-BLS; feeling for TIC; checking my gloves for BLOOD.

I am checking the BACK; looking for DCAP-BLS; feeling for TIC; checking my gloves for BLOOD.

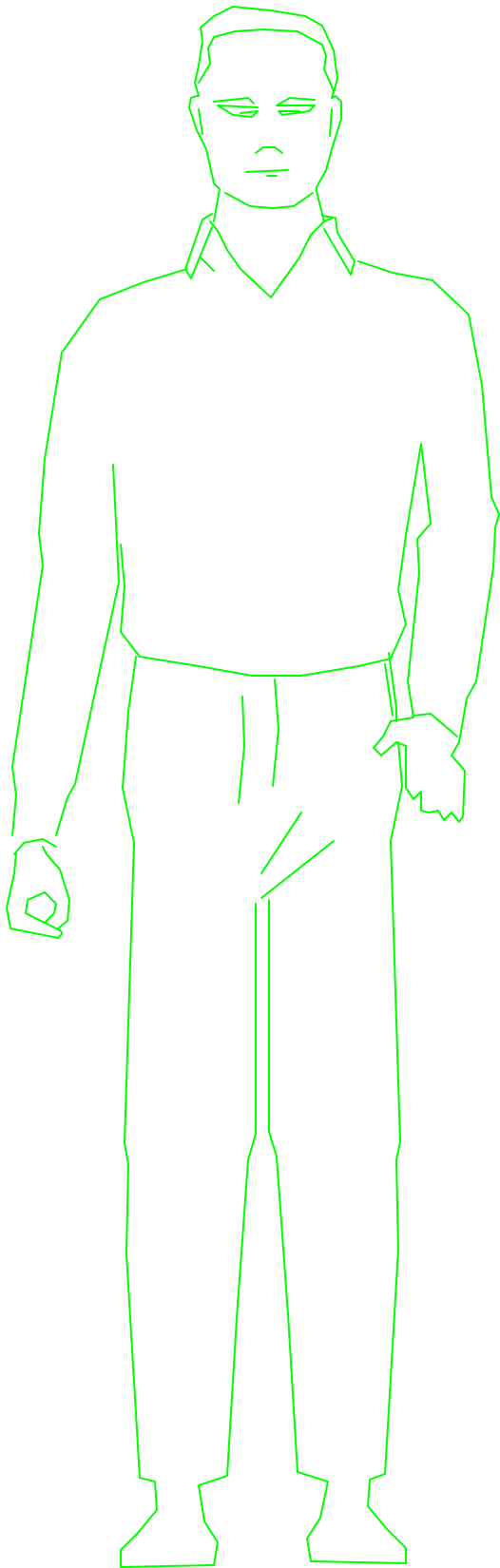

I am taking VITALS, measuring and recording; TIME; AIRWAY (open; clear); PULSE RATE; BREATHING RATE; PUPIL SIZE & REACTION; SKIN CONDITION; LOC; patient's classification of pain (0-10).

I am checking for MEDIC ALERT.

I am checking the HEAD; looking for DCAP-BLS; feeling for TIC; checking my gloves for BLEEDING; also looking for BLEEDING and FLUIDS from the ears and nose; BATTLE'S SIGN; RACCOON EYES; LOSS OF TEETH and DENTURES. "Please clench your teeth." Check for pain. I am checking the eyes for CONTACTS.

I am checking the NECK: Feel the front and the back. Looking for DCAP-BLS; Feeling for: TIC; Check gloves for BLOOD.

I am checking the CLAVICALS; looking for DCAP-BLS; feeling for TIC; checking my gloves for BLEEDING.

I am checking the SCAPULAS; looking for DCAP-BLS; feeling for TIC; checking my gloves for BLEEDING.

I am checking the CHEST; looking for: (DCLAPP-BLS); feeling for TICS; checking my gloves for BLEEDING.

I am checking the ABDOMEN; looking for DCAP-BLS; feeling for TGRDE; checking my gloves for BLEEDING.

I am checking the BACK; looking for DCAP-BLS; feeling for TIC; checking my gloves for BLEEDING.

What happened?

Where does it hurt?

What is your name? Address? Phone Number?

Do you have any medical conditions that I should know about?

Do you wear a Medic Alert?

Do you have any allergies?

Are you taking any medications? What are they for?

Are you a bleeder?

Are you wearing contact lenses?

Have you had any serious illness, injury, or operations in the last year?

When did you last eat?

When did you last go to the bathroom?

Is there anyone we can contact for you?

Any recreational drugs or alcohol today?

FOR CHEST PAIN ASK:

What were you doing when the pain started?

What does the pain feel like?

Does the pain go anywhere else?

On a scal of 0-10, with 10 the worst pain you've ever had, how would you rate this pain?
